Preparing for College

- Evaluate your A-G eligibility
 - Counselors made notes on your transcripts
- Visit Colleges onsite campus tours
 - Local universities: UC Berkeley, UC Santa Cruz, San Jose State, SF State, East Bay, St. Mary's, UOP, Stanford, Santa Clara
 - Virtual Tours are available online
- Students should start preparing personal insight questions
 - UC Applications open on August 1st
- Assess volunteer, work, leadership, athletic, or club experiences

SBAC Testing

- Testing will take place in April
- Juniors will take the English and Math
- Encourage your student to do well
 - Score can exempt students from taking a placement test in college

PE (high school graduation only) 20 credits

Advancement Opportunities or Credit Recovery

- Summer School (A-G, advancement, and/or credit recovery)
 - 6 week summer program that meets Monday Friday
 - o If AH does not offer a course, see counselor for alternative location options
- Cyber High (A-G eligibility and/or credit recovery)
 - Online college prep courses that meet after school once a week. Independent work
- Night School (credit recovery only)
 - Senior year only
 - Semester class that meets once a week from 6:20pm 9:30pm
 - Class location: AH, IHS, or Overfelt

Electives

- IB Sports Science (Sports/Exercise/Health Science)
- Exploring Computer Science
- Ethnic Studies (now open to all grades)

Silicon Valley Career Technical Education (SVCTE)

- Formally called CCOC
- Receive hands on training in their chosen career class
- Gain certificates/certifications at the end of the course
- Students take 2-3 periods at SVCTE; 3-4 periods at AH
 - Transportation is provided
- Classes include:
 - Animation
 - Auto Body
 - Culinary Arts
 - Cybersecurity
 - Forensics Science
