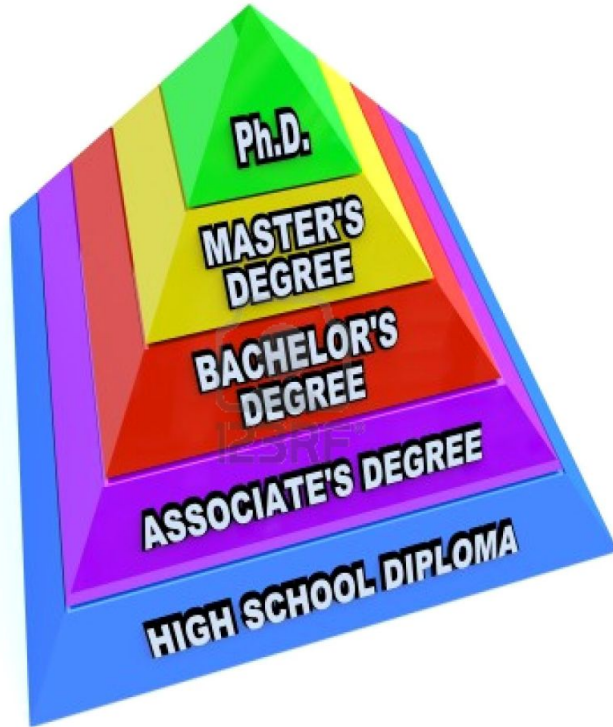

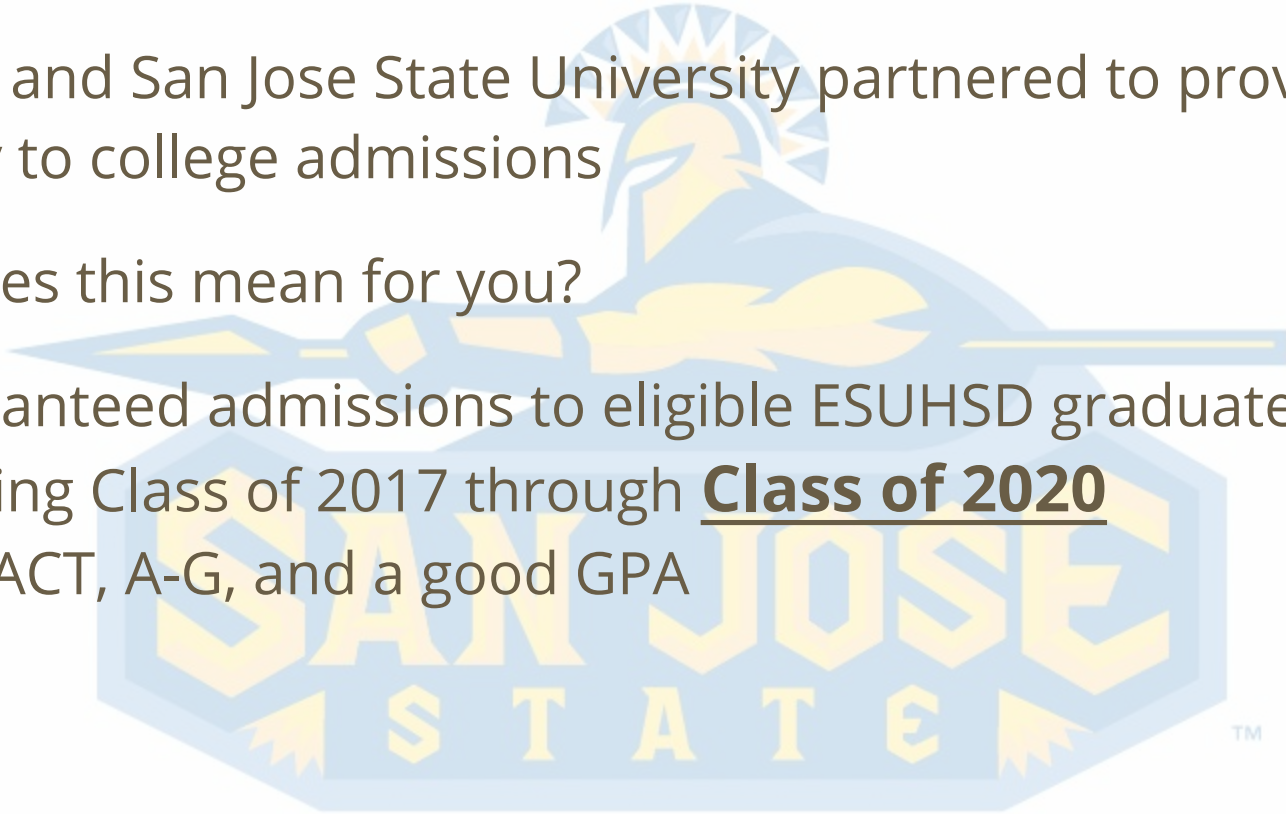


# The Spartan Promise
