 - <u>Reach Schools</u> Your dream schools that getting accepted is more challenging
 - Match Schools Schools you have met all the requirements for and that meet your requirements of what you want in a school
 - o Safe Schools Schools you expect to get into

The Spartan Promise

ESUHSD and San Jose State University partnered to provide a pathway to college admissions

What does this mean for you?

Guaranteed admissions to eligible ESUHSD graduates starting
 Class of 2017 through Class of 2021



The Spartan Promise Requirements

- Graduate from an ESUHSD school
- Apply to SJSU by November 30th, 2017
- Take the SAT or ACT and submit those official test scores to SJSU
- Successfully complete all A-G college preparatory course with grades
 C- or better
- Meet all SJSU application procedures and deadlines
- Earn a 3300 Eligibility Index (SAT) or 790 (ACT) that is verified with final transcripts

How To Calculate Eligibility Index

Eligibility Index (EI) = $SAT + (GPA \times 800)$

SAT Score: 1100 A-G GPA: 3.5

Example: $1100 + (3.5 \times 800) = 3900$

**Note: Specific programs may have a higher EI than the university admission EI

Example: SJSU The College of Engineering's EI = 4200

"A" - History 2 years required

"B" - English 4 years required

"C" - Mathematics 3 years required 4 years recommended

"D" - Laboratory Science 2 years required 3 years recommended

"E" - Foreign Language 2 years required 3 years recommended

"F" - Visual/Performing Arts 1 year required

"G" - College Prep Elective 1 year required

Where are the CSU campuses located?


There are 23 campuses across California.
