

| A+, A, A- | Excellent | Yes | Yes | 5 |
| B+, B, B- | Good | Yes | Yes | 5 |
| C+, C, C- | Average | Yes | Yes | 5 |
| D+, D, D- | Marginal | Yes | No* | 5 |
| F+, F | Failure (Repeat next year) | No | No* | 0 |

- College only accepts "A, B or C"
- "D" only counts for high school diploma not college
- Students can take class with a "D" again in summer school or Cyber High
- 5 credits for each "A, B, C or D"
- 0 credits for each "F" (take class again)
