Dear Students and Parents:

The end of the 2018-19 school year is fast approach with only twelve weeks of school left. As underclassmen prepare to move up another grade level and seniors prepare for graduation and life beyond high school, please remember your student responsibilities, and the student behavioral expectations of the school. There are many extracurricular activities to close out the school year, such as Science Camp, Fantastics, CoacHilla, Prom, and Senior activities (including graduation ceremony). This is a reminder that participation in extracurricular activities and senior activities (including graduation ceremony) are a privilege, and can be **revoked** if school rules are violated.

Examples of such violations which **may** cause a student to lose his/her privileges are:

- Suspension for fighting, possession or under the influence of illegal substances/paraphernalia, a controlled substances, alcohol, tobacco, nicotine, and/or vapes.
- Partaking in hazing, pranks, and/or vandalism of school property.
- Cutting class or excessive, unverified absences, and/or chronic tardiness.
- Academic honesty and plagiarism.
