ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTSS



No Minimum GPA Required

High School Diploma







Be 18 years or older

Degrees and Certificates

CERTIFICATE

Is usually 2 years or less of courses designated by a department. The certificates may include specific courses in a professional technical field only.

ASSOCIATES AA/AS

An Associates degree signifies that the student has completed coursework comparable to the first few(2) years of a bachelors degree. AA- has a greater importance on the humanities AS- Places a larger emphasis on the fields of math and science.

AA/AS TRANSFER DEGREES

This is a degree intended for students who wish to transfer to a four-year university. Earning an AA-T or AS-T degree guarantees your admission with junior standing to the California State University System!



BACHELOR'S DEGREE

A bachelor's degree or baccalaureate is an undergraduate academic degree awarded by colleges and universities upon completion of a course of study lasting three to seven years



TRANSFER ADMISSION GUARANTEE (TAG)

Six (6) UC Campuses offer this program, but you can only apply to one TAG Campus.

TAP - UCLA AT FOOTHILL

Through the UCLA Transfer Alliance Program (TAP), Foothill College Honors Scholars are given guaranteed priority consideration for admission to the UCLA College of Letters and Sciences. Traditionally, Foothill students experience a 70–98% acceptance rate through this program (versus 14–20%) for all other transfer applicants.

TRANSFER PROGRAMS

IGETC

This is the curriculum that fulfills the lower division core requirements at UC schools as part of the college transfer agreements. There are 34 core units required for UC schools and 37 for CSU schools. Completing the IGETC does not guarantee admissions to UC schools. However, if you are admitted, you will be on a fast track to completing your degree, as many basic requirements will already have been satisfied.

ASSOCIATES DEGREE FOR TRANSFERRING - ADT

AA-T OR AS-T

A guaranteed admission to a CSU which provides a GPA bump when applying to an impacted campus.
