- Meet with Counselor (college and career questions)
- Meet with Social Worker (stress, time management, emotional)
- Meet with Advisors (social pressures, bullying)
- Check School Loop daily
- Library access during brunch and lunch (every Wed & Thurs)
- Grades every 6 weeks (marking periods)
 - Report cards come home 2 weeks later
- Office Hours 1 Thursday every marking period from 2-3pm.
 - 2 weeks before grades (marking period)
- Free snack in the cafeteria everyday after school (3-4pm)

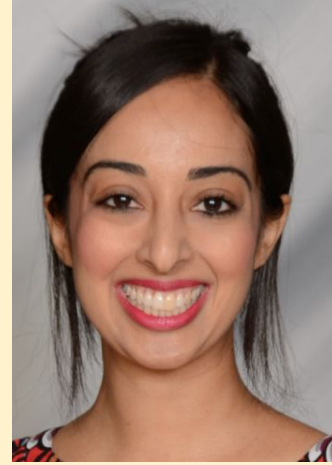

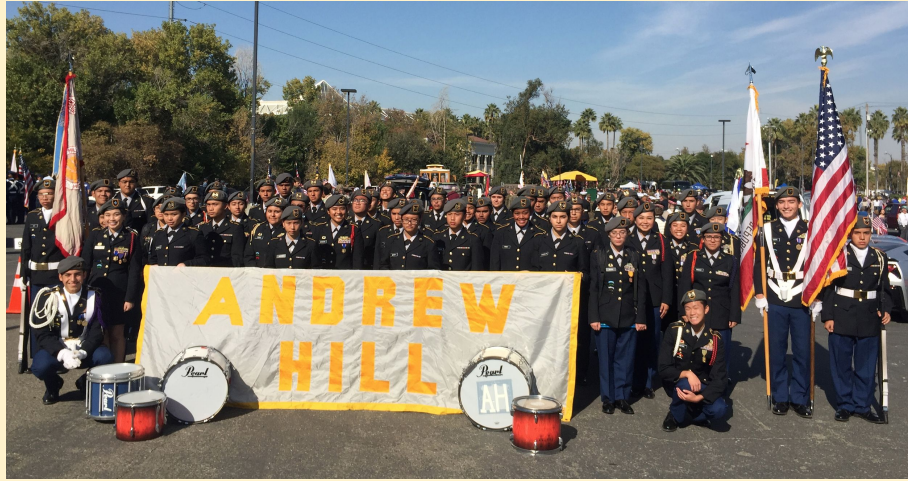

	Grades Received	Credit Received	Seen by Colleges
Report Card Grades (Every 6 weeks)	September 20 November 1 February 14 April 3	No	No
Semester Grades (Twice a year)	December 20 June 4	Yes (0 or 5 per class)	Yes (On transcript)

- Students get credits in December and May (only)
- Every 6 weeks grades are sent home (2 weeks to get home)
- School Loop shows you grades
- Dates:
 - Sept. 20
 - Nov. 1
 - Dec. 20 (credits)
 - Feb. 14
 - April 3
 - June 4 (credits)

Report Card Grades (letters)

Letter Grade	Meaning	Accepted for high school graduation	Accepted by Universities	Credits Received Per Semester
A+, A, A-	Excellent	Yes	Yes	5
B+, B, B-	Good	Yes	Yes	5
C+, C, C-	Average	Yes	Yes	5
D+, D, D-	Marginal	Yes	No*	5
F+, F	Failure (Repeat next year)	No	No*	0

- College only accepts “A, B or C”
- “D” only counts for high school diploma not college
- Students can take class with a “D” again in summer school or Cyber High
- 5 credits for each “A, B, C or D”
- 0 credits for each “F” (take class again)
