

- Students get credits in December and May (only)
- Every 6 weeks grades are sent home (2 weeks to get home)
- School Loop shows you grades
- Dates:

  - Nov. 1
  - o Dec. 20 (credits)
  - o Feb. 14
  - o April 3
  - June 4 (credits)

- College only accepts "A, B or C"
- "D" only counts for high school diploma not college
- Students can take class with a "D" again in summer school or Cyber High
- 5 credits for each "A, B, C or D"
- 0 credits for each "F" (take class again)


