# COVID-19: Coronavirus

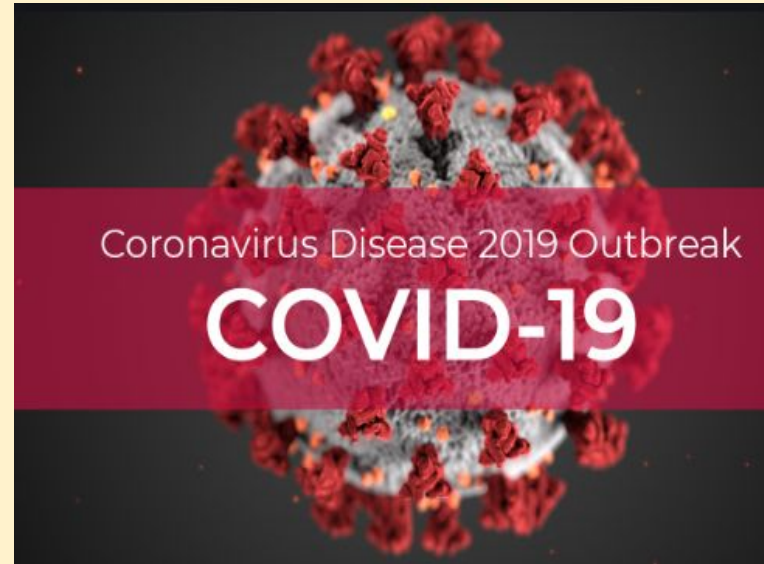
New virus that began in China.

# COVID-19: Steps to slow-down virus

There is no medicine to stop or “kill” a virus. Antibiotics only stop bacteria.

Actions to take:

- Stay home if you are sick
- Wash your hands
- Do not touch your face
- Cough into tissue
- Get plenty of rest, liquids and healthy foods




# COVID-19: District steps to slow-down

School Day continues as “usual”

Actions to take:

- Wash hands with soap
- Hand sanitizer in each classroom
  - Permanent fixtures in 2-3 weeks
- No assemblies of 100+ people in 1 space
- Limit activities in evening

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Actions, Updated March 11, 2020

Area	Actions	Effective Start Date	Projected End Date	Date of Reconsideration
School Cancellation	The Santa Clara County Public Health Department is “not recommending school closures at this time because children have not been shown to be a high-risk group for serious illness from this virus. As much as possible, children should be allowed to carry on with their education and normal activities.” CDC and County Public Health still believe schools are safe. We believe school provides a lot of continuity for many families. If the risk level changes, we will consider closures, in collaboration with County Public Health, based on the given facts and circumstances of the case(s). ESUHS is not considering voluntarily closing schools as this would cause significant disruption to our community.	March 6, 2020	June 4, 2020	daily
Meetings, Gatherings, and Events	The most recent guidance from Santa Clara County Public Health Department is that there are four considerations in evaluating events: 1) The size of the gathering; 2) The mix of individuals from various areas and age brackets; 3) The ability of individuals at events to remain at arms-length, distance from each other, and; 4) The duration of the event. Examples include events, performances, parent meetings, field trips, and fundraisers. You will be receiving information from your school/District about what events are affected. Sports	All league-sanctioned events and practices remain as scheduled. Spectators should stay at arm’s length from each other, and high-risk spectators are discouraged from attending.	March 6, 2020	April 3, 2020	April 3, 2020
Student Attendance	If you are keeping your child home due to concerns regarding COVID-19, please notify your school. After five days, a doctor’s note is required. Please know that state and county educational agencies have made it clear that students <u>should not</u> receive excused absences for this reason. An exception would be for children whose parents are under quarantine, in coordination with their health care provider and/or employer. If you have concerns, please reach out to your principal. Students with Pre-Existing Health Concerns	Some children have underlying health conditions, such as weakened immune systems, that put them at higher risk. Caregivers of children with underlying health conditions should consult with healthcare providers about whether their children should stay home. Nurses and/or administration will work with families on a case-by-case basis to make appropriate accommodations.	March 6, 2020	June 4, 2020	regularly

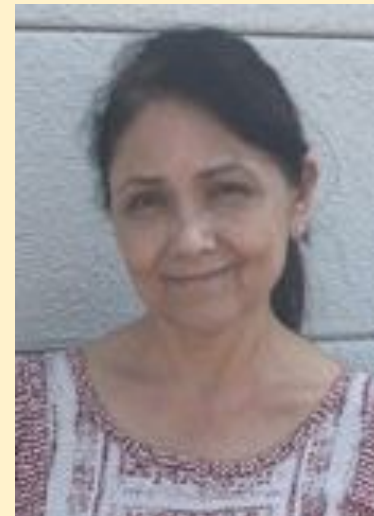
