IB Open-Minded Inquiry: How do we show that our actions matter when we meet people?

#### **Activity 1: Index Card Towers**

- **1.** In teams of 3-4 people, talk to each other about what you have in common.
- 2. Each time you find something in common, write it down on the index card.
- 3. Then use the cards to build the highest index card tower possible.
- 4. Your team has \_\_\_ minutes to build the highest tower you can.

The winning team is the one with the highest tower.

#### **Activity 2: This or That**

- 1. Everyone goes into the middle of the room/stand by your desk.
- 2. When I tell you a choice, go to the side of the room depending on what you prefer.
- 3. Let's do a practice run: Summer or winter. Winter goes to the right side of me, and summer goes to the left side of me.

IB Open-Minded Inquiry: How do we show that our actions matter when we meet others?

#### **Activity 1: Switch Sides If...**

- 1. Everyone stands on one side of the room.
- 2. Move to the other side of the room if the statement applies to you.
- 3. Let's practice: Switch sides if you have a pet.
- 4. Switch sides if that pet is a dog.

#### Activity 2: 2 Truths and 1 Lie

- 1. On the piece of paper I give you, write down 2 truths about yourself and 1 lie.
- 2. Make the lie something that people might believe about you.
- 3. After, turn to a partner near you and share what you wrote. The person with the shorter hair goes first. Try to guess which one is the lie.

### **IB OPEN-MINDED INQUIRY:** How do we communicate without speaking?

#### **Activity: Silent Lineup Round 1**

- 1) Form 2 teams on opposite sides of the room.
- 2) Without speaking, line up by height in your team.
- 3) Clap your hands twice when your team is done.
- 4) The first team to clap and is correct wins the round.



## Falcons Communicate...

## in many different ways

### **IB OPEN-MINDED INQUIRY:** How do we communicate without speaking?

#### **Silent Lineup Round 2**

- Without speaking, line up in order of your birthdate, month and date only.
- 2) Clap your hands twice when your team is done.
- 3) The first team to clap goes first as each person says their birthday in order of their lineup.
- 4) The team that is correct wins.



## to learn and find answers

### IB OPEN-MINDED INQUIRY: How do we ask what we don't know?

#### Activity 1: Snowball Questions and Answers

- 1) On the scratch paper, write down at least 1-3 questions you have that you'd like me to answer. You do not have to include your name.
- 2) The questions can be about anything that's on your mind, like about this year, the school, classes, bell schedule, where a class is, whatever you want to ask.
- 3) Crumble up the paper and throw it across the room to another person.
- 4) Pick up the snowball closest to you and share the questions on the paper to the class.



## to learn and find the answers

#### IB OPEN-MINDED INQUIRY: How do we ask what we don't know?

#### Activity 2: Snowball - I wish people knew

- On the scratch paper, write down something you wish people would know about you. You do not have to include your name.
- 2) Crumble up the paper and throw it across the room to another person.
- 3) Pick up the snowball closest to you and share what's written on the paper to the class.

### IB OPEN-MINDED INQUIRY: How do we ask what we don't know?

#### Activity: Class Survey

- 1) There are several surveys posted around the room.
- 2) With a pen/pencil/marker, read each question and mark your answer with a check mark. For some questions, you may have more than one answer, so you can mark as many as applies to you.
- 3) You have \_\_\_ minutes to do this activity.
- 4) After everyone is done, we'll have a discussion about what the class survey says.

# Falcons are Reflecting... about the Falcon 3 A's

#### IB OPEN-MINDED INQUIRY: What are the 3 A's at Andrew Hill High School?

- 1) In groups of 3, you will be given one of the Falcon 3 A's: Attendance, Attitude, or Academics.
- 2) Discuss with your group and come up with 3 examples that demonstrate/show what your Falcon A looks like in practice/life.
- 3) Your group will combine with the other groups with the same Falcon A, where you will choose the top 3 examples to share out to the class.
- 4) Make sure to pick 2 representatives to speak for your combined group.



# Falcons are Communicating... our thoughts and ideas

#### **IB OPEN-MINDED INQUIRY:** What are the 3 A's at Andrew Hill High School?

- 1) In groups of 3, you will be given one of the Falcon 3 A's Questions (A, B, C, D)
- 2) Discuss with your group and come up with your top 3 answers.
- 3) Your group will combine with the other groups with the same Falcon 3 A's Questions, where you will choose the top 3 answers to share out to the class.
- 4) Make sure to pick 2 representatives to speak for your combined group.

#### **Falcon 3 A's Questions**

- A) What does it mean to be "in attendance" of something? Does "attendance" only mean being physically present?
- B) What is meant by the word "attitude"? What are things that positively affect your attitude towards learning and presence on campus? What are some things that negatively affect your attitude towards learning and presence on campus?
- C) What does academic success mean to you? How do you learn best? What is something that you've learned in the past year? How did you feel when you learned it?
- D) How do schoolwide expectations build a better school community?



# Falcons are Inquiring... about Classroom Expectations

#### **IB Open-Minded Inquiry:** What are our classroom expectations?


- 1) Learning Matters (Academics): Put away all cell phone and technology. Be active learners.
  - a) Restroom Use: After the first 15 minutes and before the last 15 minutes of class.
- 2) You Matter (Attendance): Be in your seat by the Tardy/2nd Bell every day, every period.
- 3) Actions Matter (Attitude): Come ready to learn, use positive communication, and ask for help if you need it.
