

Job Etiquette

- 1. **Be on time:** arrive early, never skip work, never leave early without permission
- 2. **Dress appropriately:** uniform, clean and neat clothes, avoid offensive images/logos
- 3. **Unplug at work:** use phone during breaks only; give full attention to your responsibilities

4. Be considerate: use respectful language, acknowledge customers right away, communicate politely with co-workers

- **5. Self-Motivation:** stay on task, learn new skills, volunteer for projects
- 6. Learn from mistakes: accept constructive feedback, take responsibility for your actions



S.M.A.R.T. Goals!



Do: Set real numbers with real deadlines.

Don't: Say,
"I want more
visitors."



Do: Make sure your goal is trackable.

Don't: Hide behind buzzwords like, "brand engagement," or, "social influence."



Do: Work towards a goal that is challenging, but possible.

Don't: Try to take over the world in one night.



Do: Be honest with yourself- you know what you and your team are capable of.

Don't: Forget any hurdles you may have to overcome.



Do: Give yourself a deadline.

Don't: Keep pushing towards a goal you might hit, "some day."


PERSONAL GOAL: What do you want to accomplish by 4/12/24?

	Word	EXPLANATION	My Goal
S	SPECIFIC	Set a goal that is specific enough to be accomplished.	
М	MEASURABLE	Establish criteria (what you have to show) for the goal to be achieved.	
A	ACTION- ORIENTED	Involves specific actions that will result in your reaching the goal	
R	REALISTIC	Should be something that is attainable given the resources and limitations that you have	
Т	TIMELY	Allow reasonable time to complete each goal, but not so much time that you lose focus




