Scenario #2

Things you might need to find out about the project:

1. Can I change my research topic?
2. Can I get an example of a similar project?
3. How can I break up my project to complete it on time?
4. Do I need to cite my sources? I'm unsure of how to do that: Can you help me with that?

Scenario #3

You are applying for a job for the first time. You must submit a resume with references, as well as practice for the interview. You need help with this process.

Who can you ask for assistance?
What questions might you consider when applying for the job? How will you prepare for all parts?

Some questions to consider while applying for a job:

1. What skills do I have that can be utilized in this job?
2. How can I highlight my best skills?
3. How can I stand out from other applicants?
4. Who can I ask to give me honest feedback on my resume or to be my references?
5. How do I prepare for the interview?
