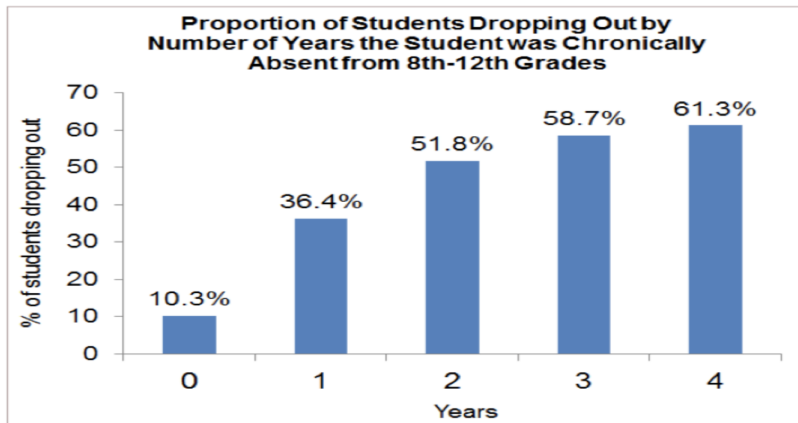
## Facts About Attendance

1. Absences in the 1st month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Students who miss 2-4 days in August go on to miss nearly a month of school.
2. By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
3. When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic grades and chances for graduating

## Chronic Absenteeism

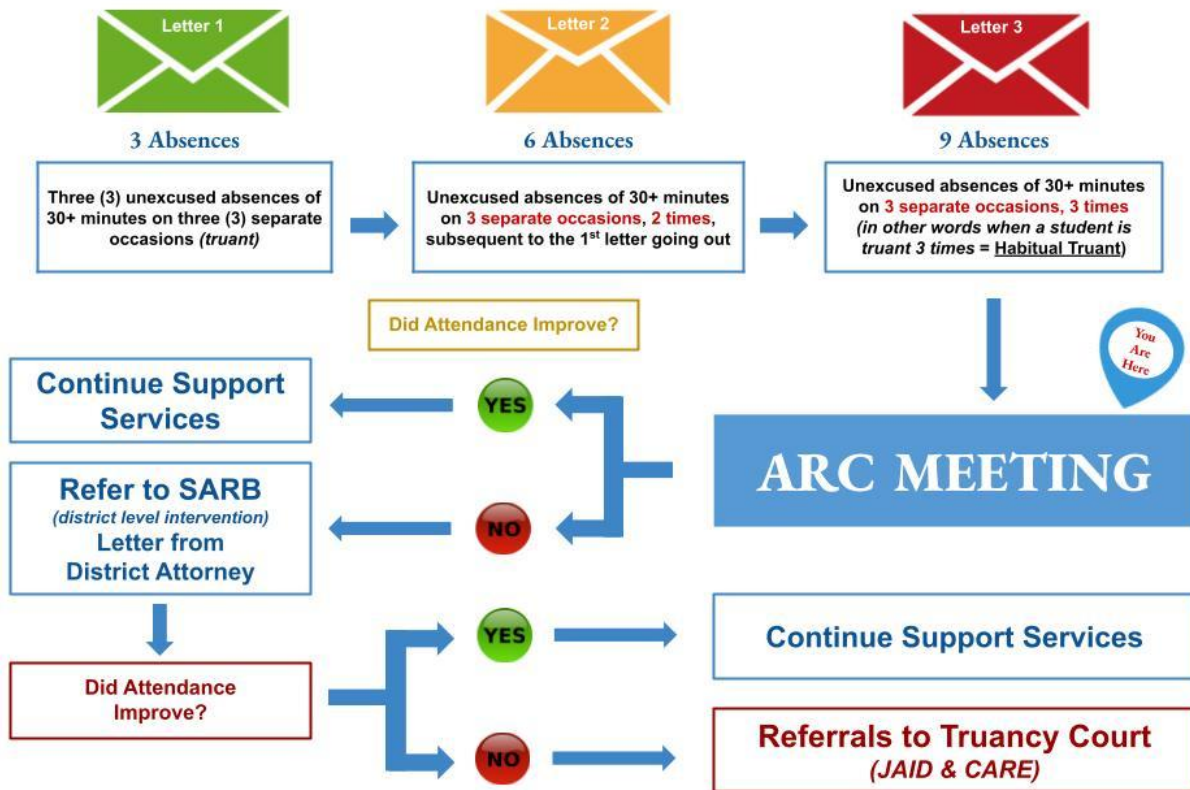
- Refers to students who miss at least 10% (18 days) of the school year. (EC Section 48263.6)
- Chronic absenteeism is a primary cause of low academic achievement and a powerful predictor of students dropping out of school (excused or unexcused).

## The Effects of Chronic Absenteeism on Drop Out Rates



With every year of chronic absenteeism, a higher percentage of students dropped out of school.

### How Can You Help?

- Verify that your contact information is updated and accurate in the school system.
- Have a conversation with your child regarding attendance and the importance of on-time attendance every day.
- Establish expectations and routines at home (example, early bedtimes and early morning routines).
- Schedule non-urgent appointments during non-school hours.
- Maintain communication with school staff.
